
Bowling!!!!

Technology Arts Center

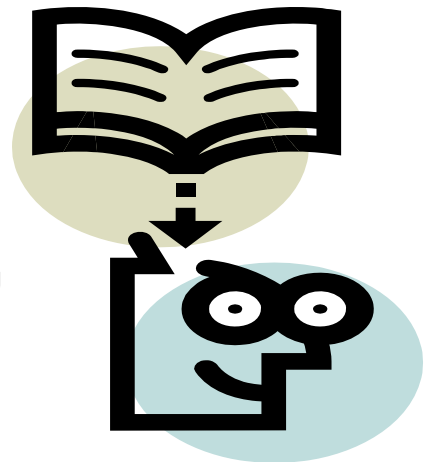

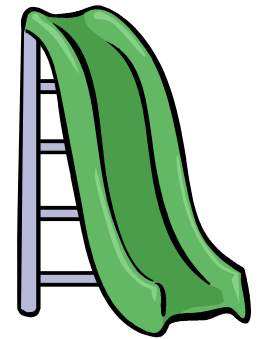
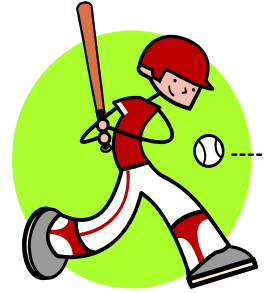
The Club's Arts & Crafts Program will be open daily, featuring art education and much more! If you like drawing, painting or just being creative, this is the place for you!

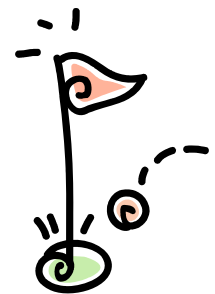

Early Bird Summer Program



The Boys & Girls Club of Greater Flint is bringing back a program for single, working parents. The **Early Bird Summer Fun Program** starting Monday, June 21 at 8:30am. Members who are signed up for this program can stay for the duration of Club hours (until 5:00pm) This program is intended for single parent, working families with one or more children; the family **MUST BE TANF** eligible. When signing a child up for the Early Bird Program, we ask that the member(s) are signed up for one week at a

time. Since space and programming will be limited, sign up will occur on a first come-first served basis and will be limited to 25 members at a time. There is a \$2.00 PER DAY fee which covers the cost of breakfast and occupancy of the building. A list of breakfast items can be obtained by request. *Applications are available in the Main Office.*

Although each day will vary, the general practice is that all members will move as a "unit". These "units" will be separated and or-

ganized based upon their age groups. Our groups are: Cadets- (7-9 year olds), Juniors (10-12 year olds), and Teens (13-17 year olds) This means that as a group the members will move from area to area, participating in various activities throughout the Club. Field Trip T-Shirts

In order to go on a field trip, members **must** purchase a Field Trip T-Shirt. A variety of sizes are available: please inquire at the main office. The cost for the shirt is \$10.00. If there is an issue with cost, (ex. More than 2 children in a family) please speak with Tauzzari for information about financial assistance. Members **CANNOT** attend field trips without the proper T-Shirt.



Pick up and Drop Off Policy

Parents and Guardians: Please be aware of the times you pick up and drop off your children. The Boys & Girls Club of Greater Flint will open its doors promptly at 12:00pm . Until this point in time, no children will be allowed in the building unless they meet the requirements for the Early Bird Program (see above for information). The same policy will be in place when the

Club closes at 5:00pm. At the end of the day, we ask that you are no more than 15 minutes late when picking up your children. For every 10 minutes after the allotted 15 minute window, there will be a \$10.00 charge placed on your child's membership account. Until the balance is paid off, members will NOT be able to participate in Club activities. If a ride is more

than 30 minutes late, the staff is obligated to contact the local police department. If you have any questions regarding any of the policies or procedures of the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Flint, please do not hesitate to call Tauzzari or Gary at (810) 249-3413.

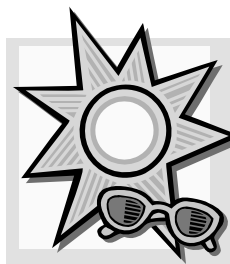
